LEARN & PERFORM

Learn and Perform is our high impact, wowstarter workshop day – perfect for introducing a topic and getting children excited about learning.

One class spend the day with our drama practitioner, learning all about their chosen topic through fun activities, drama games and role play. Across the day they develop and rehearse a short performance which can be shared towards the end of the school day, with the rest of the school and parents too.

The children play all the parts and because they're in role and immersed in the topic, the learning is fun, memorable and meaningful.

We have over 30 different Learn and Perform topics to choose from; the full list is on the page.

EXPLORE DAYS

Explore Days give between 2 and 4 classes the chance to explore a topic in just one day!

You choose your topic and how many classes you'd like us to work with. We schedule the day around your school timetable and hall availability, and plan age appropriate workshops to get your pupils exploring, learning, being creative and having fun.

An Explore Day is the perfect format for multiple form entry schools. Your classes are able to explore their topic in a fun and interactive workshop which is fully accessible for all abilities.

On the next page we have a list of our most popular topics and we can also plan workshops to meet your school's needs, so we can cover almost any topic!

Throughout the year we also provide workshop days for up to 6 classes for themed weeks and celebration events such as Anti-Bullying Week, Children's Mental Health Week, Shakespeare Week, World Book Day and Safer Internet Day.

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ANTI-BULLYING

Each year we tour Anti-Bullying performances across the UK, helping children learn about the causes and effects of bullying.

Our 2023 performance is **Superhero School.** This fun and dynamic performance is suitable for everyone from reception to Year 6.

The story follows Max, a science-mad primary school pupil, who is facing bullying and wishes he was different. One morning everything in Max's routine changes – and he finds himself at the Superhero School where he must work out what makes him special and help others too! The performance is accompanied by a workshop (or workshops) and is performed in your school hall. We have dates available during November 2023.

ONLINE SAFETY

Our online safety performances are always bang up to date and filled with topical references that will engage and excite your pupils. They're also full of practical hints and tips for staying safe online and ensuring that children consider their wellbeing as they use the internet. In 2024 we're touring **Play Post Share Repeat** – a wacky performance that looks at Tiktok, Snapchat, Instagram, WhatsApp, Youtube and more.

The performance is accompanied by a workshop (or workshops) and is performed in your school hall.

Play Post Share Repeat will be on tour between January and March 2024.



MENTAL HEALTH & WELLBEING

At Altru, we are passionate about supporting children's mental health and each year we tour a play for KSI exploring the issues. **What's Up Alfie?** will be back on tour next spring – helping children learn about the five ways to wellbeing during an exciting journey through Grandad's attic, space, a pirate ship and The Olympics!

In 2024 we'll also be touring a brand new show for KS2 – this is a pilot project with just a handful of dates available. If you'd like to sign up to be a pilot school for this project then get in touch using the details on the back page.

DRUGS & ALCOHOL

Eyes Open is our longest running performance, suitable for Upper Key Stage 2 and full of information about the legal, human and social consequences of using drugs and alcohol. The performance is accompanied by a workshop where children work with the actors to further explore the issues raised.

Eyes Open is a hard-hitting but fun performance, which really engages pupils in taking ownership for their actions and choices, and understanding what the impact of these choices might be.

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CHRISTMAS 2023 PINOCCHIO!

This Christmas we're touring a new adaptation of Pinocchio to schools, libraries and community venues!

This 60 minute performance is suitable for everyone from reception to Year 6 (and teachers will be thoroughly entertained too!) The play features original songs which children can join in with, live music played on stage and lots of audience participation.

And, because this is an Altru play, there will also be a wonderful message and children will be encouraged to read as they see the book used throughout the play to guide the story and the actors.

We're also excited to announce that Pinocchio will be available to book in the summer term of 2024 - as a special treat or a way to bring all classes together.
